Dear CHC Colleagues,

In 2017, the Clark Honors College began the transition from being the residential home for tenure-track faculty to a faculty-in-residence model.

Today, Provost Patrick Phillips announced that the CHC will complete the transition to the FiR model this spring, re-assigning residential TTF faculty in CHC to tenure homes in the College of Arts and Sciences. Those faculty who are interested will have the opportunity to apply immediately for faculty-in-residence positions in the CHC.

In close cooperation with the CHC and the CAS Deans' Office, the Office of the Provost will begin the process of transitioning faculty members to departmental homes in the next few weeks.

For years, residential faculty have made many contributions to the CHC, as teachers, scholars, and mentors. The CHC will always be grateful for their service and contributions. Please let me know if you have any questions about this transition.
